The Mission and Evangelism Team at St. Andrew's is sponsoring a Build Day on Saturday, November 11, from 12:30PM to 4:00PM in partnership with Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP). SHP is a ministry in the United States and Canada that provides children who have no place to sleep with pillows, bedding, and bunk beds. Although many charities work to provide children and families in need with toys, food, and clothing, SHP is one of only a few organizations devoted to offering children a bed, a "basic need for the proper physical, emotional, and mental support that a child needs." 


CONFIRMATION MEETING


