But whether you are in the "bringing" camp or the "ringing" camp or perhaps have never even given it much thought, I propose we consider a new approach...

## **PRAYING IN THE NEW YEAR!**

- **Pew Sisters Class,** for women of all ages, meets in Room 2 and will study *Traveling Light* by Max Lucado.
- **Bible Discovery Class,** for men and women of all ages, meets in the library and will study *Life Lessons from Acts, by Max Lucado*.
- The **Youth Group,** for youth grades 6-12, meets in the Youth Center at 5:00PM on Sundays. They will study *Forward Motion,* which explores what it means to follow Christ and to walk with Him daily.

## **2024** Confirmation Class

Confirmation is a time for students to explore their faith and dig deeper into the Bible, church history, and Presbyterian traditions, while also growing in community with one another. When a baby is baptized in a Presbyterian Church, the parents and the whole church make vows to lovingly raise that child in the Christian faith. When a child reaches adolescence, they are provided with a period of study and intentional reflection. Confirmation is a purposeful time in which we encourage students to take ownership of their faith in hopes that they might claim Christ as their own.

The 2024 Confirmation Class will have its first class on Sunday, January 7 in the Youth Center. Students will meet monthly with Pastor Tara according to the following class schedule: **January 7, February 11, March 24, April 21, and May 5.** All classes are required and will meet 12:00PM-5:00PM. Pray for our students as they embark on this journey of faith exploration and discipleship!
