

"For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known." - 1 Corinthians 13:12

A recent Pew survey found that 65 percent of Americans say they often or always feel exhausted when thinking about politics and 55 percent often or always feel angry. The question that seems to be on most people's minds in recent years is: How do we make sense of these times in which we are living?

Really what I think we are asking is: Where is God in all of this? Where is God in the political upheaval, the continued strains of inflation, the ongoing wars and escalating conflicts around the world, and the storms of life (both literally and figuratively)?

We want to understand how God is at work in the midst of all that disappoints and hurts. Ultimately, we are asking to see God, to know He is present and in control. And in some ways, we are asking for a sign, some glimpse of supernatural activity, to reassure us that our faith and hope have not been misplaced. The apostle Paul tells us that on this side of eternity, we will not see completely or understand clearly the full picture of God's activity. And that is okay because what matters at the moment is not our knowledge of God, but God's knowledge of us.

So, the next time you feel like you are left with more questions than answers remember this:

God knows you. God loves you. God is at work.

The one thing we can be certain of in all seasons of life is that God never fails; the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus make this abundantly clear. So instead of being filled with worry and anger and consumed with oversimplified soundbites and "us versus them" mentalities, allow the Spirit to fill you with the peace of Christ that surpasses our ability to understand. May we be rooted and grounded in Christ's love so that His love will be reflected in us, bringing hope and peace to those around us.


St. Andrew's Members Invited to Join the Golden Triangle Square and Round Dancers

St. Andrew's will collect the PW Thank Offering on Sunday, September 15. The Thank Offering began in 1888, when Eliza Clokey of Ohio urged each woman to give one dollar more than her usual contribution to Presbyterian missions. In the 135 years since Eliza first asked women to give a "thank offering to her Lord," more than 1,600 projects in the U.S. and abroad have benefited from grants funded by faithful and generous givers.

One of this year's recipients, in the Synod of Mid-Atlantic (Presbytery of New Hope) is the SAFEchild Advocacy Center. SAFE stands for *Stop Abuse for Every Child*. This organization is the leading voice for child abuse prevention through evaluation, intervention, and treatment in Wake County, North Carolina. SAFEchild offers children and families a safer future, where they can find support and live into their true capabilities and callings.




PEACE AND GLOBAL WITNESS OFFERING
