GOD IS ON THE MOVE!

One of the things I love about the wilderness wanderings is the Tent of the Meeting, and later the Tabernacle, where Moses and the Israelites could inquire of the Lord. I love the portability of this meeting place. It served as a visible reminder that as they wandered and moved about, God moved with them. More accurately, it was a reminder that God is on the move and bringing them along.

In the New Testament, we see that Jesus did not stay in any one place for long. He was constantly moving from one place to another, engaging with all sorts of people and situations. In His life and ministry, Jesus also moved through every part of the human experience. He encountered everything from temptation to joy, to love, to opposition, to suffering, and even death.

This Lent we will step into the movement of Jesus' ministry. As we travel from temptation to condemnation, we will look at some of His teachings and miracles, culminating in Christ's death and resurrection.

On our journey, we will see that when we encounter Jesus, we cannot stay the same. We are called to move and grow and change as followers of Jesus, to be imitators of Him, as we live out the Gospel. Together we will discover once more that God is still on the move in our lives, walking every step of the way with us.



ASH WEDNESDAY

Join us for a special worship service on **Wednesday, February 14, at 6:30pm** as we begin our Lenten journey together.

Marking the beginning of a forty-day fast, Ash Wednesday is a time to meditate on our mortality and sinfulness; to commit to repentance and sacrifice; and most of all, to confidently recall that Christ is victorious over sin and death and that He is the one who enables our repentance.

Our service will include special music, communion, and the imposition of ashes. Ashes are a symbol of human frailty, and a reminder that we are "dead to sin and alive in Jesus Christ" (Romans 6:11).



Update on Pete & Gloria's Mission trip in November



Pastor Wilber Machado's church, near Santiago de Cuba, now has a dedicated clean water system, trained operators who are responsible for producing water and maintaining the system, and an education program to teach basic health and hygiene practices. After struggling with a contaminated water pumped from a shallow well for more than 20 years, safe, clean drinking water is now being distributed to church families and the surrounding community.

At the request of Aymara Martinez, a Cuban nurse, we delivered medical supplies donated by our team and the Catholic Daughters of America in Orange, TX. Facing dire conditions at hospitals and clinics, doctors and nurses must often work without basic items like surgical masks, gloves, bandages and sutures.

Sadly, most Cubans are struggling with very difficult economic conditions. Government rations of rice, meat, and cooking oil have been reduced. In the market, food is very expensive and often not available. Power blackouts occur daily. Job opportunities and salaries are meager, so many young people and professionals have left the country.
