NEW CHURCHWIDE STUDY COMING SOON!

Last year we journeyed through the Bible together and discovered there is one central message woven throughout all sixty-six books of the Bible. God, who created us, desires a relationship with us and the Bible tells the one story of God's plan to redeem us. The CASKET EMPTY acronym helped us to understand the major flow of the Biblical narrative.

Our next study, **Believe**, will build on this foundation with a focus on applying the truths of Scripture to our daily lives and relationships. After all, the goal of Bible study is not simply to learn facts but to grow as disciples.

What we believe drives everything we do in life: how we treat others, how we measure success, how we raise our children, who we are inside. This churchwide study will have us asking the questions: What do I believe?, Who am I becoming?, and How should my beliefs direct my actions?

Together we will explore these questions and more beginning on Sunday, April 21, 2024.

Grounded in Scripture, **Believe**, is focused on spiritual growth, and helps Christians of all ages think, act, and be more like Jesus. Our study is divided into the following three key areas of Christian discipleship:

THINK (beliefs): what do I believe? 10 Key Beliefs of the Christian Faith **ACT** (practices): what do I do? 10 Key Practices of a Jesus-follower **BE** (virtues): who am I becoming?

10 Key Virtues of a Person Who is Becoming More Like Jesus

The **Believe** study will help us dig deeper into the core beliefs of the Christian faith, put them into practice, and examine the fruit of our lives. Study materials will be available in the church office and after worship services beginning March 24, 2024.

A member of the church has generously donated 80 sets of the study materials so there should not be a cost for anyone to participate.






















CHANCEL FLOWERS

FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The St. Andrew's Foundation administers two scholarship funds for church members, the Virginia Anderson Scholarship Fund and the Drennan Scholarship Fund.

The Virginia Anderson Scholarship Fund was established as a memorial gift from Murray Anderson to honor his wife, Virginia. This fund provides scholarships to qualified students for their freshman (or first) semester of college or trade school.

The Drennan Scholarship Fund was established by a bequest to St. Andrew's from W. B. "Pappy" Drennan. The purpose of this fund is to provide scholarships to qualified students after they have completed their freshman year (at least 24 semester credit hours) and may also be used for post-graduate studies.

The deadline to apply is April 5, 2024.






What is an interesting fact people may not know about you?
