It recounted his interactions with various people as he sought to live out Paul's example of being all things to all people in order to share the Gospel. If I am being honest, the story was really cheesy, and the artwork was laughable. However, it was a fun way to explore a Biblical principle and reflect on our identity in Christ and who we are becoming as Jesus' disciples.

What Will Change: Instead of returning to the pews following the Time for Children, the children will meet volunteers at the sanctuary doors to go to the



journey classroom for a child-friendly worship service. This time will include music, Bible teaching, and other activities. Parents will pick up their children from this classroom at the end of worship.

The goal of Children's Church will be to teach our children about worship while also helping them grow in their understanding of Scripture. Our curriculum will be *Dig In: The Bible in One Year*.

<u>What Is Next</u>: We are recruiting a team of volunteers to share in the leadership of this new ministry initiative so no one will have to miss worship more than once every 4-6 weeks. If you are interested in being part of the team (or want to learn more), please speak with either Pastor Tara, Valera Messer, or Brian Armstrong.

Orientation and Training: There will be an orientation for volunteers on Sunday, February 9, immediately following the church luncheon. The purpose of the orientation is to introduce you to the curriculum and Children's Church format as well as answer any questions you may have. This orientation should take about a half hour. Additionally, there will be a Safe Sanctuary training for all volunteers on Sunday, February 23, immediately following worship. A light lunch will be provided.

DAY SCHOOL NEWS



Presbyterian Women Birthday Offering

Received in the spring each year, it gives women a tangible way to celebrate the blessings in their lives. This offering celebrates the anniversary of the PW's founding by funding up to five projects each year. Supporting the Birthday Offering is a wonderful way to put faith into action by helping organizations and projects that make a significant impact in communities.

The Red Cloud Renewable Lakota Thiyuha Dome Home in Pine Ridge, South Dakota, is one of the initiatives selected for 2025. The Lakota Thiyuha Project aims to increase housing availability through construction of innovative dome homes that are energy efficient, economical, simple in design and easily teachable.

The grant will help to construct three dome homes, providing housing as well as creating publicity for this affordable option. Construction apprentices will gain experience in this building technique that can rapidly and affordably increase housing availability for Lakota families in need.

St. Andrew's Foundation Scholarship

The St. Andrew's Foundation administers two scholarship funds for church members, the Virginia Anderson Scholarship Fund and the Drennan Scholarship Fund.

The Virginia Anderson Scholarship Fund was established as a memorial gift from Murray Anderson to honor his wife, Virginia. This fund provides scholarships to qualified students for their freshman (or first) semester of college or trade school.

The Drennan Scholarship Fund was established by a bequest to St. Andrew's from W. B. "Pappy" Drennan. The purpose of this fund is to provide scholarships to qualified students after they have completed their freshman year (at least 24 semester credit hours) and may also be used for post-graduate studies.






