## SERMON ON THE MOUNT

The Sermon on the Mount consists of Matthew 5-7 and presents the teachings of Jesus on various topics related to the Christian life, discipleship, and living in the kingdom of God. This sermon is considered one of the most well-known and cherished passages of Scripture, with parts of its content being famous even beyond the church. It serves as guidance for the Christian community and for life within the kingdom of God, while still existing as pilgrims in the world.

It begins with a surprise announcement that the good life of God's Kingdom has come to the least likely people. Then, in the main body, Jesus teaches how to do right by God and others. And finally, the conclusion calls for a decision by its hearers.

John Stott has noted that the Sermon on the Mount is "probably the best known part of the teaching of Jesus, though arguably it is the least understood, and certainly it is the least obeyed."

So, why should we study the Sermon on the Mount? Because it will challenge us to think differently about Jesus. It will push us to reflect deeply on grace and law. And it will compel us to consider soberly what it means to be a disciple.

Beginning June 15, we will embark on a twelve-week exploration of this critical teaching of Jesus.







The goal of Children's Church is to teach our children about worship while also helping them grow in their understanding of Scripture. Our curriculum is *Dig In: The Bible in One Year*.


## ADULT CLASSES ON SUNDAYS


