G. K. Chesterton, the clever 20th-century author, once challenged our limited view of giving thanks. He wrote, "You say grace before meals. All right. But I say grace before the concert and the opera, and grace before the play and pantomime, and grace before I open a book, and grace before sketching, painting, swimming, fencing, boxing, walking, playing, dancing and grace before I dip the pen in the ink."

For most of us, "saying grace" is a ritual reserved for the dinner table. It is a meaningful practice that rightly recognizes God's provision for our food. But as Chesterton reminds us, our thanksgiving should not be limited to a few words over a meal, nor confined to the month of November and an annual holiday.

Chesterton's words call us to maintain a constant attitude of gratitude, recognizing God's presence in every part of our lives. In doing so, we transform our entire life into an act of worship. Our gratitude extends beyond our food to include our very being, which is sustained by God's continual and abundant grace.

Living a life of gratitude shifts our focus from what we lack to the abundance of God's blessings, revealing His goodness in the ordinary. When we train our hearts to see life as a gift, we begin to find peace and joy in every season.

With the conclusion of our **FAITH OUT LOUD** series, let us respond with gratitude to the promises of Jesus and dedicate ourselves to making His kingdom a reality on earth.

As we come to the end of another year, we want to remind you of a potential tax savings if you are required to take an RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) from your IRA. If you have your financial advisor send your distribution directly to the charity you desire to give to (church, Food Bank, etc.) this will bypass you and you do not have to pay taxes on those distributions. You can contribute to more than one charity as long as you do not receive the funds yourself. Any 503(c) corporation is legal. Your financial advisor can help you accomplish this.



CONFIRMATION MEETING




















SCOTTISH SUNDAY

Beginning November 30, St. Andrew's will begin a churchwide study called *The Heart that Grew Three Sizes* based on Dr. Suess' *How the Grinch Stole Christmas*. Join us for a heartwarming and Biblical take on a beloved story. We don't know why the Grinch hated Christmas. We just know he did. In this Advent study, Matt Rawle explores the faith themes in this Christmas classic, including, how the grinch's heart grew three sizes come Christmas morning.

How did Christmas save the Grinch? Could it be that the very thing we think we hate is the one thing that changes our lives? Rediscover the gift of Advent that comes without packages, ribbons, or bows.


