In college, I once played the Pick 3 using numbers from a fortune cookie. I had never played the lottery before, but something about the numbers on my fortune convinced me it was a good idea. Imagine my surprise when I found out the next day that I had won \$300! That wasn't chump change, especially for a college student in the mid-90s. Naturally, my first thoughts were about how to treat myself with my winnings. Then, I considered more responsible options, such as using the money for school costs. Ultimately, I decided to donate the entire amount to my church. Part of my reason was that I felt a little weird about "winning the lottery." But more than that, the timing of the winnings coincided with a period when I was wrestling with my own practice of tithing.

Tithing was something I knew the Bible taught. I understood it conceptually as a discipline rooted in trust, gratitude, and generosity. I knew it in theory, but when it came to doing it, I wasn't as convinced. It was easier to justify not tithing because I was paying for college and had bills to cover. I gave when I could, I rationalized, even though I knew in my heart I should be more intentional about giving. When I won the \$300, I realized it was an opportunity to stop playing games with God. It was an unexpected blessing. I didn't need the money; I could meet all my financial obligations without it. So why not give it to God? Why not acknowledge the blessing and return it to Him to be used to bless others? That decision became the turning point in my practice of biblical stewardship. If I had made a different choice, I'm confident I wouldn't even remember what I spent the winnings on. But giving it to my church marked my commitment to God and His good purposes of redeeming and renewing the world.

As we continue to look at ways to live our **FAITH OUT LOUD**, we will examine this practice of stewardship and why it matters. My prayer is that we will all continue to grow in our commitment to giving back to the Lord in response to His goodness to us.





The goal of Children's Church is to teach our children about worship while also helping them grow in their understanding of Scripture. Our curriculum is *Dig In: The Bible in One Year*.


ADULT CLASSES




