Just as Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness, Lent invites us to pause in our daily routines to reconnect with God. Lent offers a sacred, intentional pause to shift focus toward spiritual renewal and deeper intimacy with God before Easter. This season encourages reflection, repentance, and intentional fasting to make room for God's presence.

As we begin the season of Lent, we are invited to set aside the distractions of our daily lives and focus on the core of the Gospel: the profound, sacrificial love of Jesus Christ. While Lent is often seen as a time for personal sacrifice, it is, more importantly, an invitation to walk alongside our Savior during the final hours of His earthly life.

Consider the weight of that final day. We see Jesus in the upper room washing feet, and in the Garden of Gethsemane wrestling with the weight of the sins He was about to bear. We witness betrayal and denial by friends, unjust trials, and brutality by the authorities of the day, along with the exhaustion of the journey to Calvary. By focusing on these moments, we do not simply observe history; we confront the reality of our need for a Savior.

Our churchwide Lenten study, **24 Hours That Changed the World**, will guide us in meditating on the final hours of Jesus' life. It will be a journey leading us to the foot of the cross so that we may be renewed at the empty tomb on Easter Sunday.

"But He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on Him, and by His wounds we are healed." – Isaiah 53:5

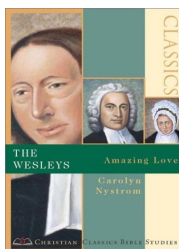
ADULT CLASSES



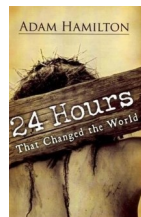

ASH WEDNESDAY

Join us for a special worship service on **Wednesday, February 18, at 7:00pm** as we begin our Lenten journey together.

Marking the beginning of Lent, Ash Wednesday is a time to meditate on our mortality and sinfulness; to commit to repentance and sacrifice; and most of all, to confidently recall that Christ is victorious over sin and death and that He is the one who enables our repentance.

Our service will include special music, communion, and the imposition of ashes. Ashes are a symbol of human frailty, and a reminder that we are "dead to sin and alive in Jesus Christ" (Romans 6:11).
